The EDA investment will be matched with \$4.4 million in local funds and is expected to create or retain nearly 225 jobs and generate \$360,000 in private investment, according to grantee estimates. This EDA grant will be matched with \$326,120 in local funds and is expected to create or retain 100 jobs, according to grantee estimates. The grant facilitates the acquisition of a fixed-wing single engine aircraft, LiDAR bathymetric laser scanner sensor, and related components for the Tribe's Airborne LiDAR and Mapping Enterprise Program, Condor Aviation. The equipment will advance the Yurok Tribe's efforts to collect important topographic and imagery data needed for the effective management of the Tribe's natural resources. The enterprise will also be available to service the needs of other government agencies in Northern CA, and will create new jobs and opportunities for Tribal members in STEM career fields. This EDA grant is expected to create or retain more than 20 jobs, according to grantee estimates. This project is funded under EDA's American Rescue Plan Indigenous Communities program.
