- 8 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

1	(1) on October 8, 2012, the César E. Chávez
2	National Monument was established by Presidential
3	Proclamation 8884 (54 U.S.C. 320301 note) for the
4	purposes of protecting and interpreting the nation-
5	ally significant resources associated with the prop-
6	erty in Keene, California, known as "Nuestra
7	Señora Reina de la Paz'';
8	(2) Nuestra Señora Reina de la Paz—
9	(A) served as the national headquarters of
10	the United Farm Workers; and
11	(B) was the home and workplace of César
12	E. Chávez, the family of César E. Chávez,
13	union members, and supporters of César E.
14	Chávez;
15	(3) while the César E. Chávez National Monu-
16	ment marks the extraordinary achievements and
17	contributions to the history of the United States by
18	César Chávez and the farmworker movement, there
19	are other significant sites in the States of California
20	and Arizona that are important to the story of the
21	farmworker movement; and
22	(4) in the study conducted by the National
23	Park Service entitled "César Chávez Special Re-
24	source Study and Environmental Assessment" and

1	submitted to Congress on October 24, 2013, the Na-
2	tional Park Service—
3	(A)(i) found that several sites associated
4	with César E. Chávez and the farmworker
5	movement—
6	(I) are suitable for inclusion in the
7	National Park System; and
8	(II) depict a distinct and important
9	aspect of the history of the United States
10	not otherwise adequately represented at ex-
11	isting units of the National Park System;
12	and
13	(ii) recommended that Congress establish a
14	national historical park to honor the role that
15	César E. Chávez played in lifting up the lives
16	of farmworkers; and
17	(B)(i) found that the route of the 1966
18	march from Delano to Sacramento, California,
19	meets National Historic Landmark criteria;
20	(ii) recommended that the potential for
21	designation of the route as a national historic
22	trail be further explored; and
23	(iii) indicated that the National Park Serv-
24	ice could work with partner organizations and
25	agencies to provide for interpretation programs

1	along the route of the 1966 march from Delano
2	to Sacramento, California.
3	(b) Purpose.—The purpose of this Act is to estab-
4	lish the César E. Chávez and the Farmworker Movement
5	National Historical Park—
6	(1) to help preserve, protect, and interpret the

8	César Chávez and the farmworker movement;
9	(2) to interpret and provide for a broader un-

10	(1) In general.—The boundary of the histor-
11	ical park shall include the area identified as "César

21	(f) General Management Plan.—
22	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 years after
23	the date on which funds are made available to carry
24	out this subsection, the Secretary shall prepare a
25	general management plan for the historical park in

1	accordance with section 100502 of title 54, United
2	States Code.
3	(2) Additional sites.—
4	(A) IN GENERAL.—The general manage-
5	ment plan prepared under paragraph (1) shall
6	include a determination of whether there are—
7	(i) sites located in the Coachella Val-
8	ley in the State of California that were re-
9	viewed in the Study that should be added
10	to the historical park;
11	(ii) additional representative sites in
12	the States that were reviewed in the Study
13	that should be added to the historical park;
14	or
15	(iii) sites outside of the States in the
16	United States that relate to the farm-
17	worker movement that should be linked to,
18	and interpreted at, the historical park.
19	(B) RECOMMENDATION.—On completion of
20	the preparation of the general management
21	plan under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall
22	submit to the Committee on Energy and Nat-
23	ural Resources of the Senate and the Com-

2	tional sites to be included in the historical park.
3	(3) Consultation.—The general management
4	plan under paragraph (1) shall be prepared in con-
5	sultation with—
6	(A) any owner of land that is included
7	within the boundaries of the historical park;

9	(B) appropriate Federal, State, and Tribal
10	agencies, public and private organizations, and
11	individuals, including—
12	(i) the National Chávez Center; and
13	(ii) the César Chávez Foundation.
